

This tree of ropes and crystals is the result of a progressive process of evaporation and capillarity from which a hybrid form, midway between the organic and the fossil, emerges. The title of the work quotes Gilbert Simondon, the philosopher of the "mentalité technique": a scholar of the psychosociological and historical-cultural development of technical objects who, avoiding the abstractness of deductive thinking, pitched various disciplinary fields against one another to highlight the absolute uniqueness of individual events. The work by Jorge Peris (Alzira, 1969) takes on a different form each time it is installed. The skeleton of salt crystals that solidifies along the ropes in

fact produces concretions of different structures and stability, depending on the dynamic relationship created between the balance of salinity levels in the liquid used, controlled by the artist, and the humidity levels in the environment.





Conceived specifically for Galería 6 at IVAM, this project by Jorge Peris (Alzira, 1969) co-opts the actual structure of the exhibition hall itself, with the categorical presence of its diagonals, columns and staircase. Taking the gallery as a kind of blank sheet, Peris constructs a singular new space in which different times and places coexist in one single spatio-temporal dimension, thus transforming the various overlapping elements into an overall installation.

The artist's return in 2011 to Valencia, the city where he had spent his time as an art school student, adds an autobiographical layer to the project which is rendered in various different ways, for instance in the presence of elements from his surrounding environs and also in artistic references associated with his formative years in Valencia. One of the key features of Peris's project is how it is undergirded by opposing ideas or concepts, akin to conceptual pairings proper to philosophy, which bring to the surface all kinds of conflicts or dichotomies through their tensions and balances











Jorge has put forward two installations that complement each other conceptually, like two sides of the same coin. They start from a common point, an axis marked by the golden ratio's representation, piercing the top two floors of the gallery and outlining a series of connections which draw a sequence, a coherence, a logic.

In the installation titled Olmo, salt conducts energy and life and is a reference to the very origins, a sea that accompanies an indelible memory, a defining presence in his work.

Jorge sketches paths through which salt runs, drawing up a sequence that measures the universe, from the monumental to the minute.

Peris' body of work has focused on the creation of site-specific installations, made mainly with local materials, which gives a deep-rooted sense to his work, which can be experienced in the spaces created.

The Italian art nouveau staircase expands its steps in one of the rooms of the gallery, and constructs a genuine forged iron fortress, with impossible cantilevers and a balancing game that refers us to the poetics of the spiral.



The island of El Palmar, in the Natural Park de la Albufera in the vicinity of Valencia, is an ancient place, tied to millennial traditions, its life dictated by the relation with salt water constantly brushing the shores.

His work has been following the pace and essence of the landscape, defined by sedimentation, stratification, and the action of time.

As in an expanded natural spectacle, the artist recovers the most diverse residues, channels them in his studio, where he materializes objects and creatures, subtracted from their transitory suspension.

In a sort of private system of reconstruction, Peris juxtaposes found stones, debris, ruins of architectural structures - both ancient and modern - in order to construct his poetical megaliths (Dolmen), with their graceful levity compensating the gravity and weight of their material of origin. 

Short Biography

Peris is known for creating site-specific installations that challenge the viewer's senses as well as the conventional physicality of the gallery space. produced mainly with local materials and thus bringing a deep rooted sense to his work. Much of his production is organic, so life continues pulsating in them during the exhibition.

The artist operates with the given space and transforms it by adding or subtracting architectural elements. He creates a new situation, felt as real, yet unsettling, in which the sensation of familiarity falls apart.

Whilst this space challenges the relationship with the viewers, the viewers question their conventional perception of it. The works alter the fabric of their host location, often precipitating the latter into a premature state of decay.

His immersive works simulate nature's entropic processes in an accelerated form and they possess a unique temporal dimension.
